

WHEREAS there was a Proprietors Meeting held in Hopkinton, at the House of Capt. Edward Wells, the 24th Day of November last past, by the Proprietors of the New Township at the Northward of Albany, called Westely, purchased of Mr. John Rogers, under Colonel John Henry Lydius: In which said Meeting, each Proprietor's Lot in said Township was drawn, and Record made of the same. Further, it was also concluded and voted in said Meeting, that each Proprietor that should neglect to settle their proportional Part of the Charge with the Clerk, should have their Lots exposed to Publick Sale, the Twenty fourth Day of May next ensuing the Date hereof.

PURSUANT to the Vote of said Meeting, these are to warn the said Proprietors of said Township, that have not paid their Part, forthwith to come (or send) to me at Stonington Harbour, and settle your proportional Part of the Charge, which shall prevent the Sale of your Lots, as aforesaid; otherwise I must pursue the Vote of the said Meeting.
